Why a disposable N95 mask is not such a good idea:

Protection

Keep in mind that an N95-class filter is allowed to leak up to 5% according to NIOSH. Are you willing to accept that risk?

Uncertainty

Can a disposable N95 filtering facepiece be fit-checked with an accurate result?

Single use

A disposable N95 respirator is just that: disposable. It is intended for single use only. You will need to buy a lot of respirators.

Cost over time

You might need at least four disposable N95 respirators every day. An influenza pandemic might last for up to 18 months. That means more than 2,000 masks.
